









# **URGENT MEASURES COVID-19**

Barcelona, 12 March 2020

#### **SUMMARY**

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the COVID-19 virus to be <u>a pandemic</u>. As a result of the public health emergency at both the national and international level resulting from the rapid spread of the virus, both the central and regional governments are adopting, among others, various measures to guarantee the social protection of workers and to regulate the socio-economic impact of the virus.

### CENTRAL GOVERNMENT

A Royal Decree Law 6/2020 of 10 March adopting certain urgent measures in the economic area and for the protection of public health

Article 5 of the Royal Decree-Law declares that periods of isolation or contagion of workers as a result of the COVID-19 virus are to receive the same consideration, on an exceptional basis, as occupational accidents for the purposes of economic benefits for temporary disability under the Social Security system.

It is stipulated that the duration will be determined by the medical reports ordering isolation and the subsequent return to work.

The right to this benefit will be extended to both salaried and self-employed workers that are registered under any of the Social Security schemes at the time of contagion or isolation.

The measure enters force today, 12 March 2020.

## **CATALONIA**

The Catalonian regional authorities have adopted various measures and recommendations to combat the pandemic:









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- A In the employment area, on 9 March the Department of Labour, Social Affairs and Families, CCOO, UGT, FOMENT and PIMEC published, by consensus, a *Guide with recommendations for companies and workers on actions related to situations that may arise due to CORONAVIRUS SARS COV 2*, which can be consulted at the following link.
- A Earlier today, the Catalonian Regional Government announced various measures which are pending approval and publication. These include a €1,000 million line of loans to increase companies' liquidity, arranged by financial institutions and backed by the Institut Català de Finances and Avalis. The Catalonian Regional Government will assume 75% of the credit risk.
- A In addition, a package of measures has been announced to encourage teleworking and internal flexibility to allow changes in working hours whenever possible, and a reinforcement of the Technical Office of Barriers to Internationalisation of the Catalonian Government's Enterprise and Knowledge Department has been planned.

It is expected that in the coming days, new measures will be adopted in both the employment and socio-economic areas in order to address the pandemic caused by COVID-19. We will keep you informed of the measures taken.
